## Board Analyst Certification Board-Verified Course Sequence

### Purpose of Course Sequence

The undergraduate course sequence in Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) provides students with the 225 hours of coursework required for taking the Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst (BCaBA) exam administered by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board (BACB). Students who complete this course sequence will acquire a strong foundation in the fundamental principles of behavior as they pertain to early childhood and learn how ABA is used in classrooms and other service settings for behavior and classroom management and assessing and providing instruction for children with developmental and intellectual disabilities, as well as how to use ABA ethically in research and practice.
