



About UTSA Online

UTSA Online offers the **same degree, same faculty, and same rigor** as traditional programs at UTSA. Courses are offered in **16-week** and **8-week** sessions.

Note: Not all programs are available at UTSA Online, but we are still growing. [Check out our current programs.](#)

- » UTSA Online students are **Self-Supported**, which means the program is self-sustaining and does not receive any state funding. See the **Cost** section below for more information.
- » Only students who are admitted to UTSA Online may enroll in online program courses.
- » The difference between **UTSA Online** and **Traditional Programs** that may be online:
 - » **UTSA Online:** programs that are 100% online and asynchronous, delivered through UTSA Online.
 - » **Traditional programs with an online component:** programs that have online classes but are delivered through the traditional campus.

Cost

UTSA Online students pay a flat program fee (which varies per program). Students are not required to pay any additional fees beyond the tuition cost. Books and other course requirements would be at the student's expense.

- » **Undergraduate:** \$486-\$525 per credit hour
- » **Graduate:** \$550-\$825 per credit hour

Financial Aid

UTSA Online students are encouraged to apply for financial aid through the FAFSA and will be considered for federal and state need-based financial aid such as Federal Pell Grant, Federal Direct Student Loans, and TEXAS Grant. Admissions Frequently Asked Questions

- » **Does UTSA Online process their own admissions?** UTSA Online students are admitted the same way traditional UTSA students are. All students must apply to the admissions office to be processed.
- » **How do students apply for the UTSA Online program?** UTSA Online Students have 3 application options:
 - » Scarlet (Exclusive to the online programs)
 - » ApplyTexas
 - » CommonApp
- » **Are there any differences between the Scarlet application and ApplyTexas & Common App?** The Scarlet application is exclusive for 100% online programs. This application will stay open for the 2nd 8-week term and has custom questions not found in ApplyTexas or the Common App.
- » **Do current UTSA students who want to apply to UTSA Online need to reapply?** When a new student (who hasn't registered) wants to switch from residential to online, an online enrollment counselor will interview each student and explore different options they have. The enrollment team will also cover any obstacles that need to be considered by the student.

Current UTSA students do not need to reapply to enroll in a UTSA Online program. They simply need to fill out the **Change of Major Appointment Request form** on the Advising website or contact our enrollment team at **210-458-4000**.

Note: Students cannot be enrolled in a Residential and Online program at the same time.

- » **What if prospective students applied to residential but changed their mind and now want an online program?** Students can contact our enrollment counselors at **210-458-4000**. Our enrollment counselors will walk them through the process and help them understand their options before filling out the **Change of Major Appointment Request form**.
- » **Why are admissions deadlines sometimes different for UTSA Online applicants?** UTSA Online has both 8-week and 16-week terms. The second 8-week term has a later start date, and therefore we have a later application deadline to accommodate students who apply for the second 8-week session.
- » **Do UTSA Online students complete the same New Student Orientation as residential students?** UTSA Online students complete a virtual new student orientation through their myUTSA account (Previously known as ASAP). Upon completion, students sign up for their own advising appointment. The Online New Student Orientation has no cost for the student.
