During every stage of development, youth and families engage with various social systems, such as health care, education, child welfare, and the justice system. These systems can be a vital support; they can also be challenging and difficult to navigate depending on the circumstances.

This experiential learning course focuses on understanding youth and family systems, the impact of trauma and resilience when engaging in systems, and how to effectively advocate and be involved in decision-making as a consumer of services, a practitioner providing services, and an ally.

Students will engage in an experiential family court case simulation with community members to explore more about social justice and advocacy in youth and family systems.
