PAD 3153 Administrative Law and Policy

What do climate change adaptation, affordable housing, DACA, and election reform all have in common? The most important decisions on these crucial policies are made not by elected officials but by governmental agencies. Although this administrative process can be mysterious, it shouldn't be, since it affects our lives in so many ways.

This course invites you to dive in on some of the most exciting policy issues of our times, while also getting a sense of the rules that govern administrative decision making.

Course is taught by Dr. Francine Romero, PAD Department chair, and a newly appointed Trustee for CPS Energy (so expect some discussion on energy and climate crisis issues).

This course is hybrid, meeting in person on Tuesdays from 10:30-11:45 at the DT campus, with one online asynchronous session per week.

PAD 3083 Project Management for Public Sector Employees

How do you make sure a project is finished on time, on budget, and in a way that actually meets the goals of key stakeholders? There are many different perspectives in project management, and this course hopes to address some of the ways public sector employees manage projects big and small.

This course will introduce key concepts of project management, including methodology and tools for problem-solving, stakeholder engagement, and working in teams to meet a goal.

The course is taught by Sarah Serpas, AICP, a certified urban planner and Ph.D. student in Applied Demography with public and nonprofit sector work experience.

This course is hybrid, meeting in person on Mondays from 12:00-1:15pm at the DT campus, with online asynchronous work also assigned each week.
