

## **NON-HONORS STUDENTS IN HONORS CLASSES**

### **HONORS COLLEGE POLICIES**

Non-Honors students may take Honors courses when space is available. The following policies apply to requests from non-Honors students to take Honors courses.

1. Requests from non-Honors students will be considered for courses that meet Core curriculum requirements and other lower-division Honors courses beginning one month prior to the start of a term.
2. Requests from non-Honors students will be considered for upper-division Honors courses beginning 3 weeks after the opening of registration.
3. Non-Honors students may only enroll in an Honors course when course enrollment is less than 26 students.
4. In general, to enroll in an Honors course, non-Honors students must typically meet Honors standards (e.g., GPA of 3.25+ for students with college course work or rank in the top 20% and a composite ACT of 27+ or a composite M+CR SAT of 1200+ for students enrolling directly out of high school). Non-Honors students will occasionally be allowed to enroll in non-Honors courses with a GPA of 3.0 to 3.25 if those courses have particularly low enrollment (e.g., < 20 students). Additional requirements may be imposed for individual courses. For example, non-Honors students who wish to take an Honors course that has a prerequisite must have earned a grade of “A” in the prerequisite course.
5. Preference for enrollment in lower-division Honors courses will go to students who are NOT participating in the CAP Program.
6. If multiple non-Honors students apply to participate in an individual Honors course, preference will be granted to the students with the highest GPAs.
7. There is no guarantee that an individual request for enrollment in a non-Honors course will be granted. All requests for non-Honors students to take Honors courses are reviewed by the Associate Dean of the Honors College and all decisions are final.
