



The Role of Tibetan Monks in Today's Society

The national tour of *Mystical Arts of Tibet* will perform at The University of Texas at San Antonio November 14-17.

Monks from the Drepung Loseling Monastery in south India who are performing in the tour will offer a lecture, *The Role of Tibetan Monks in Today's Society*, at the UTSA Institute of Texan Cultures on Wednesday, November 16, at 7 p.m. The lecture will explore cultural traditions, contributions to world peace, and perspective on current events in Tibet.

Seating is limited, and will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis. The lecture will be preceded by a demonstration on the art of spinning, weaving, and use of natural dyes on the exhibit floor starting at 5 p.m.

Admission is free for museum members and UTSA students, faculty, and staff with ID. Regular admission is \$10 for adults (12 – 64), and \$8 for seniors (65+) and children (6 – 11). The museum is located at 801 East Cesar E. Chavez Blvd. adjacent to Hemisfair.

Drepung Loseling Monastery, Inc. was formed in Atlanta, GA in 1991 as the North American seat of the monastery. Drepung Loseling Monastery is academically affiliated with Emory University, with the objective of promoting trans-cultural understanding and scholarly exchange. This historic affiliation between two major institutions of learning was inaugurated by His Holiness the Dalai Lama on May 12, 1998.
