UTSA Russian Program

UTSA's Russian program provides four levels of instruction from elementary to advanced for students to build language proficiency skills. In all levels of language study, students gain an understanding of Russia's cultural heritage, discuss Russia's role in geopolitics, and explore cultures from other Russian-speaking countries. In addition to language classes, each semester we offer literature, film, and culture courses taught in English under the classification of Comparative Studies in the Humanities (CSH).

Study Russian!

Approximately 260 million people speak Russian worldwide. The US Department of State classifies Russian as a "critical language." Russian is one of 15 languages deemed to be critical to America's national security and economic prosperity.

Developing proficiency in Russian gives students access to in-demand fields of employment, both in government and private sectors. By majoring or minoring in Russian language, students develop communication skills and critical thinking skills that will be marketable across career fields.

Recent graduates of our program have worked at the US Department of State, traveled in the Peace Corps, have been awarded Fulbright Scholarships, and have enrolled at UT Law.
