Sessions will be selected based on the quality of the proposal and its ability to meet the objective of the Colloquium. Presenters will be notified by email if their session is/is not selected. If your session is selected, it is the responsibility of the presenter(s) to appear at the Colloquium and present the agreed upon session.

Colloquium Details:

1. Presenters of poster sessions will be required to print their posters and bring the poster with them the day of the Colloquium. Stands will be provided to hang the poster on. The posters will be on display throughout the Colloquium and presenters will need to be present at their posters to share information about their research and answer questions.
2. You are welcome to bring and distribute handouts.
3. Presenters requiring technology for their presentation should bring any technology needed with them. Event organizers cannot guarantee access to power sources, so it is recommended that the technology does not require access to power.
4. Sessions should be 20 minutes with 5 minutes for discussion with the audience. The audience will move to another table/session after 25 minutes.
5. Sessions will be held at round tables and will have 8-10 participants at the table.
