The Testimonios of a Rosa that Grew from Concrete: Lessons for the Enactment of Humanization in Education

In this presentation, Dra. Maria del Carmen Salazar will share four testimonios of her personal and educational experiences. She was born in Mexico and is the daughter of Mexican immigrants. She was ripped from the arms of her mother country as an infant and faced many hardships in the U.S. The rosa emerged from the harshness and beauty of the concrete. Dra. Salazar was recently promoted to full professor at the University of Denver. She is the first woman of color to earn this distinction in the Morgridge College of Education, originating in the late 1800's. Dra. Salazar shares lessons that emerge from her experiences that have led her to enact humanization in education. She shares three specific lines of her research and scholarship on humanization: a humanizing pedagogy, teacher evaluation as culture, and the development of humanizing Community School Zones.
