The two films *War and Peace* and *Prejudice and Pride*, both narrated by Benjamin Bratt, together tell the epic story of the Mexican American fight for equality from World War II through the 1970s...how two generations claimed their place in America...on their own terms.

Prejudice and Pride tells the story of the Chicano civil rights movement during the 1960s and 1970s, and the creation of Chicano identity. This film is the fifth-hour of *Latino Americans*, a six-hour documentary series for national broadcast on PBS that chronicles the history of Latinos in the United States.
