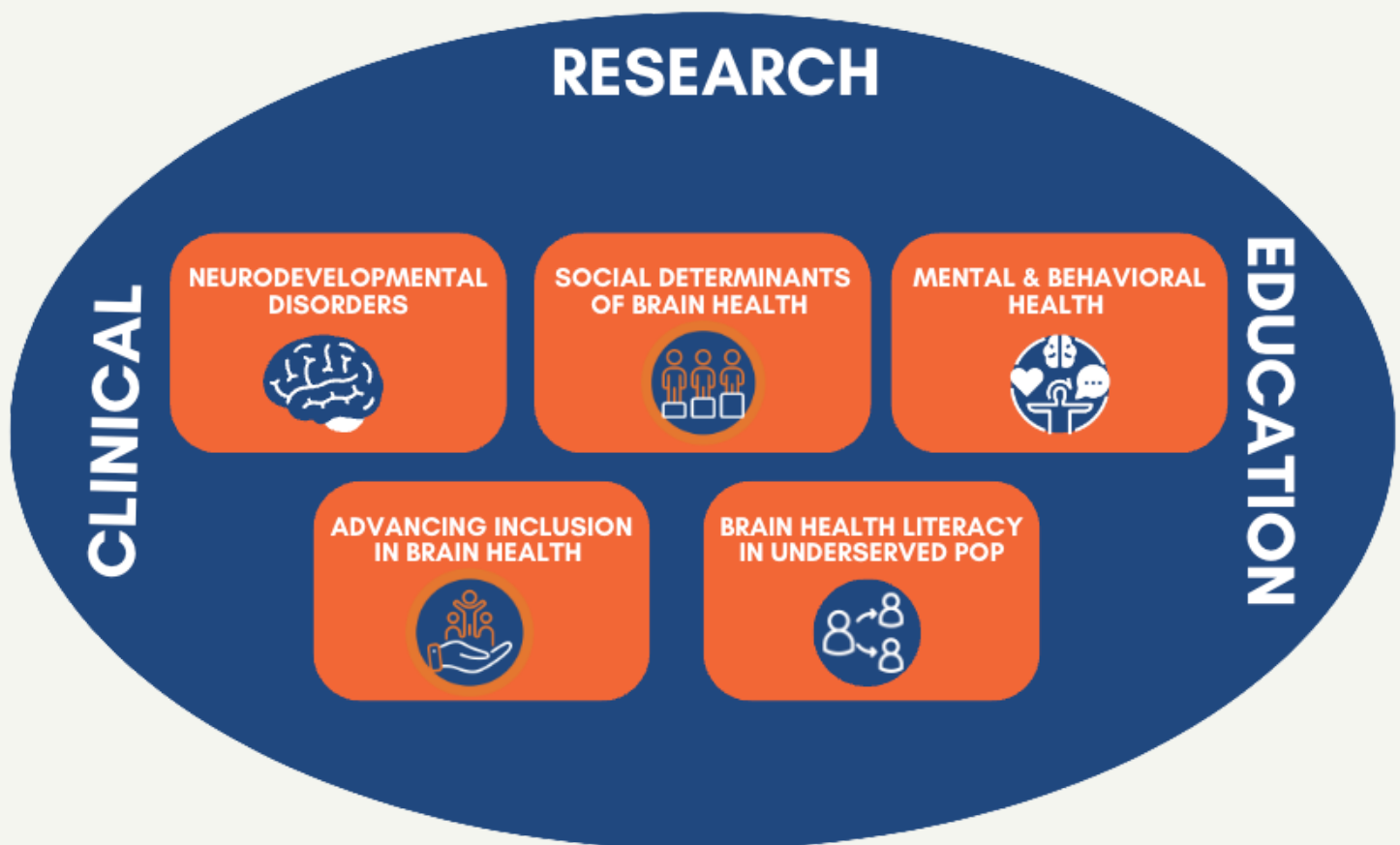

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See yourself in Brain Health

The College of Education and Human Development is uniquely qualified to elevate Brain Health Research. Below are some ideas on how you might see yourself in Brain Health:

1. Collecting qualitative community-based data on how to improve health/brain health literacy for underrepresented minority populations
2. Investigating long-term effects of education access on future health outcomes
3. Developing protocols to recruit diverse populations for brain health research through community-based participatory research methodologies
4. Training the next generation of mental health providers
5. Training the next generation of behavioral health providers
6. Providing community services to improve known risk factors of brain health (e.g., generational educational equity)
7. Training educators in low SES areas to improve educational equity outcomes (which is a social determinant of future brain health)
8. Investigating a new intervention for brain/mental health
9. Investigating novel service models for providing mental health services in schools
10. Collecting qualitative data on perceptions of health/educational equity issues from diverse populations
