During that time TASP has promoted the study of play, forged alliances with various organizations advancing the cause for play, organized yearly meetings to disseminate play research, and produced an impressive catalogue of play research through a variety of publications. Volume 13 of the Play and Culture Series seek contributions that reflect upon the rich forty-year history of TASP, that explore current research advancing the field of play, and that advance future directions for play research.

Manuscripts for the 13th Volume of the Play and Culture Series can include:

- Empirical, theoretical, and position papers
- Play research spanning various disciplines (e.g., anthropology, education, psychology, sociology, recreation and leisure studies, history, folklore, dance, communication, the arts, kinesiology, philosophy, cultural studies, playwork, child life, physical therapy, occupational therapy, musicology, etc.)
- Pure and applied research reports on various aspects of play
- Policy critiques and expositions
- Advocacy papers advancing the child's right to play
- Essays and other forms of reflective writing that further our understanding of play in humans and animals, across various cultural, social, and activity settings
- Writing that builds on the experiences and voices of children
