This is the first compendium of international research on writing with contributions from eminent scholars across the globe. The 600-page volume includes 77 contributors and 93 images that represent half of a century of exemplary quantitative and qualitative research on writing. The chapters demonstrate the evolution of writing from vessel writing to computer writing. 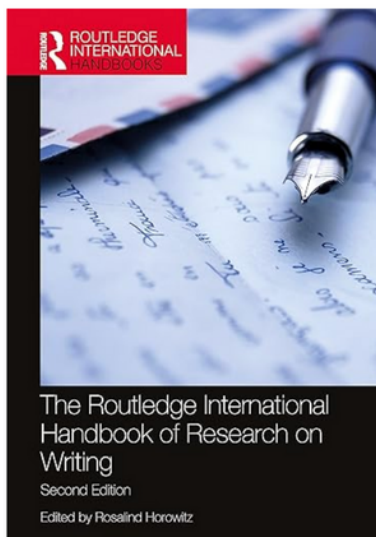
