Adelina Anthony - Keynote Speaker

In a keynote speech titled, "No Tiene Madre: Or How to Succeed in Life as a Sinvergüenza," Adelina Anthony—a native of San Antonio, Texas, and a first-generation college student—will employ personal and professional anecdotes to address the making of an artistic life. For more than twenty years, as a two-spirit Xicana lesbian artist, Anthony has created a reputation for her use of brazen political humor and salacious Spanglish in her works. In this speech, she will trace the poetics and politics of her linguistic grounding to her own MeXicana childhood. Crosshatching class, race/ethnicity, sexuality, gender, spirituality, and more, a complex portrait of Anthony's own Tejana mother will take shape. This daughter-mother relationship serves as a genesis for much of Anthony's work and for her own feminista understanding of trailblazing womyn.



Olga Madrid - Women's Advocate of the Year

Life member and past president of YWCA San Antonio, Olga Madrid raised funds and secured City of San Antonio support for the YWCA community center in the Las Palmas area on the West Side of San Antonio. The center opened in 1977 and was named the "Olga H. Madrid Center." It houses the Child Development Center and many of its other community services. This year, the YWCA SA celebrates the center's 40th anniversary. She has also been active in numerous civic efforts focused on improving the community through educational opportunity, enhanced healthcare, and beautification efforts.
