What is the Meta-Analysis Training Institute?

The Meta-Analysis Training Institute is a one-week intensive workshop aimed at researchers interested in conducting IES Goal 1 meta-analyses of important educational research topics.

What is the purpose of the Meta-Analysis Training Institute?

To train researchers in state-of-the-art advanced meta-analytic methods that are less commonly taught in introductory meta-analysis courses and workshops.

Who is teaching the Meta-Analysis Training Institute?

Five experts in systematic review and meta-analysis will teach the course. Dr. Terri Pigott is the Principal Investigator and instructor. The Co-Principal Investigators and additional instructors include: Dr. Natasha Beretvas, University of Texas at Austin; Dr. Joshua R. Polanin, American Institutes for Research; Dr. Elizabeth Tipton, Northwestern University; Dr. Ryan Williams, American Institutes for Research.

Who is eligible to attend?

U.S. citizens and resident aliens who have completed their doctorate by the time the workshop begins. Doctoral students focusing on research methodology and/or statistics may be considered on a case by case basis. Students will need a letter of recommendation from their advisor speaking to their methods training and promise for future research.

How much does the Meta-Analysis Training Institute cost?

Attending the workshop is generously sponsored by the Institute of Education Sciences and is free to participants. This includes airfare, hotel, and per diem.
