



Racial Justice Graduate Teaching Fellow

The Department of Race, Ethnicity, Gender, and Sexuality Studies (REGSS) and Women's Studies Institute (WSI) seek UTSA graduate students to work on the Mellon-funded Democratizing Racial Justice project, a community-academic partnership. Fellows will serve as teaching assistants and teach one course per semester, such as **Introduction to African American Studies, Latino Cultural Expressions, or Introduction to Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies.**

Must have a MA degree [18 hours of graduate work in ethnic studies, gender studies, a humanities field, humanistic social sciences, or related field]. Preference for applicants with coursework and/or interdisciplinary research related to racial justice topics. 19 hours per week. Appointment is for Fall 2023 through Summer 2024, with the potential for renewal.

To apply, submit a C.V. (1-2 pages), names and contact information of three professional references, and cover letter (1-2 pages) describing: your career goals, teaching experience (research or academic interests), experience with or interest in working with racial justice issues, ability to work with diverse groups, and reason for your interest in this position.
