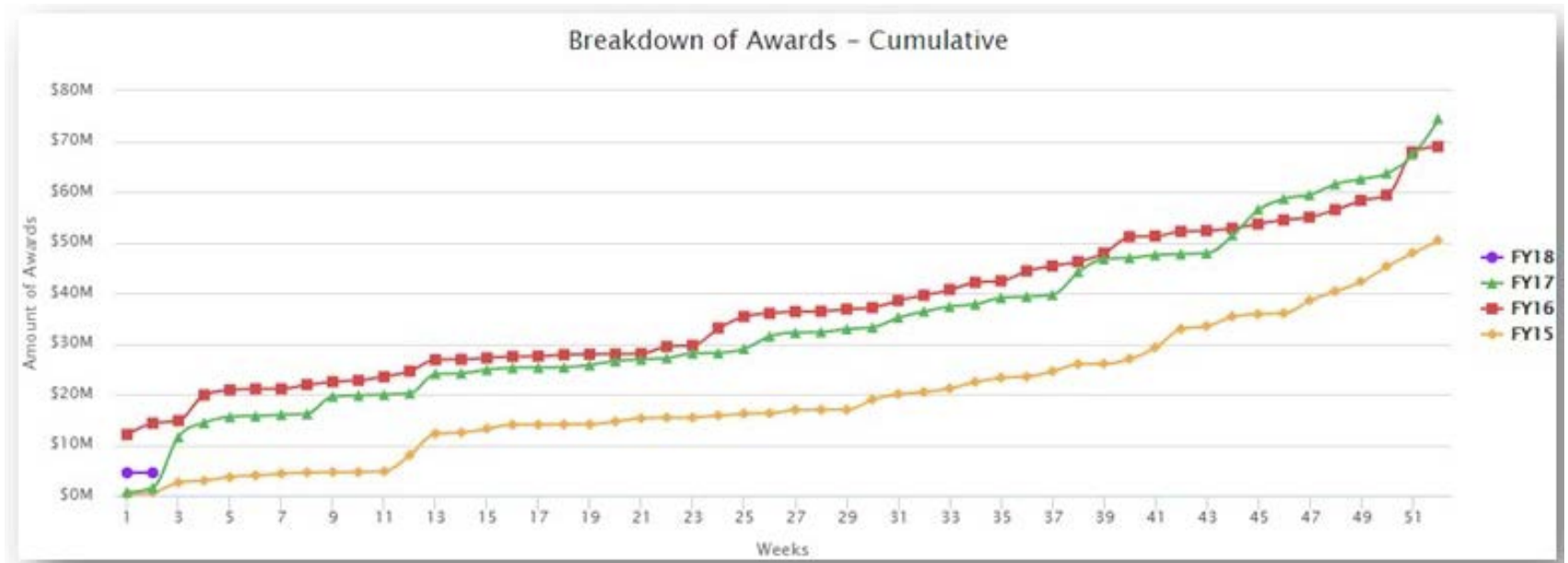

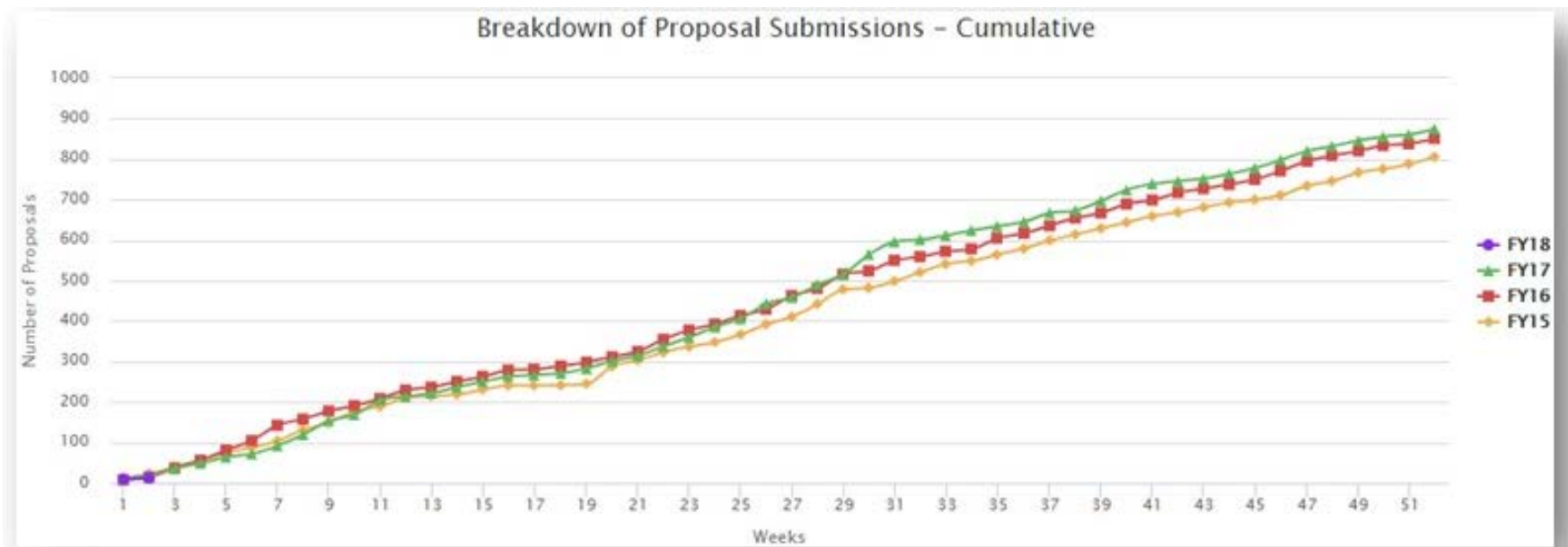

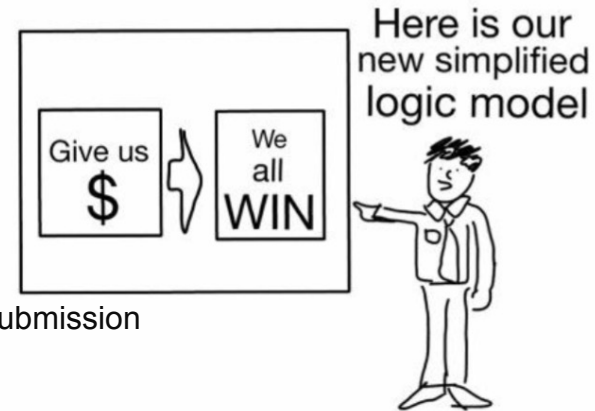

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Research Support Services

The following services are available through the COEHD Dean's Office, in partnership with the VPR's Office of Research Support.

- Funding Search Assistance
 - Use of internal and external funding opportunity databases
- Strategic Consultations
 - Solicitation analysis, feedback on strategy
 - Liaison with sponsors to clarify funding priorities and requirements
 - Assistance with identifying potential collaborators
 - Review of feedback from prior submission(s) – analysis and guidance for resubmission
- Project Coordination *(for more complex and/or multidisciplinary projects)*
 - Review of project team roles/responsibilities
 - Creation and management of internal project development timeline
 - Scheduling of team meetings
 - Discussion of development task assignments
- Grantsmanship Editing & Review
 - Grammatical editing
 - Review for responsiveness to sponsor priorities, overall organization of document(s), completeness
 - Guidance on non-technical aspects of proposal
 - Coordination of external peer review of proposal drafts
- Other
 - Drafting / coordination of signatures for institutional letters of support (dean, provost, other VPs)
 - Gathering of institutional or college-level data
 - Reaching out to previously funded PIs for guidance and/or requesting copies of previously funded proposals (if possible)
